



A safe cycling and walking route between Udny and the Formartine Way has never been closer.

For many years there has been the dream of creating a path along the long-disused track that runs from Wood Recyclability to near the Formartine & Buchan Way. This is sometimes referred to as the Drove Rd. A 2019 survey showed that this would be a very popular development with people in the community who could use it for going to work, shops, schools and cafes, as well as for recreation.

The dream took a big step closer to reality a few years ago when the Aberdeen Endowment Trust kindly gifted most of the route to the Udny Community Trust. And things progressed again in



2022 when Udny & Dudwick Estate gave their written approval for the creation of a path along the edge of the field next to the Wood Recyclability yard.

That left the small matter of actually building the 900m path along with the associated fencing and drainage at an estimated cost of more than £60,000.

I'm very pleased to report that Aberdeenshire Council have now agreed to entirely fund and construct this route in the coming financial year.

What will this look like? It will be a roughly 2m wide grit path with offset wooden bollards at both ends. It will be suitable for walking, cycling, horse-riding, plus all-terrain wheelchairs and buggies.

At some point it will have a bench installed part way along it and there's been talk of planting fruit trees to nourish the peckish walkers of future autumns.

In 2024 the Paths Group intends to submit a proposal to Sustrans to re-route National Cycle Route 1 along the path. This would bring more economic activity to Udny and make an easier and safer route than the present hill road to Newmachar.

WoodRecyclAbility develops its Strategy for Fundraising

A professional fundraiser said to me that succeeding with grant applications is a bit like panning for gold. That said, WoodrecyclAbility has enjoyed considerable success with its grant applications in the past, enabling expenditure on a number of essential projects that we could simply not afford from our meagre operating profits. However, the requirement to replace our aged and struggling wood chipper creates a significant challenge. We need funding of some $\pounds 150,000 -$ way more than we have ever sought to raise.

The advice from Aberdeenshire Voluntary Action is to develop a funding strategy that sets out our intent and includes all the information that is likely to be called for in applications, as well as prioritising our funding needs. These of course go much further than replacing the woodchipper. We have therefore, in conjunction with our sister organisation the charity Friends of WoodrecyclAbility developed our Fundraising strategy.

Pat Reid, who volunteers her time to scour the web for grant opportunities and then complete and submit those that seem a good fit with our needs and challenges, will find having most of the information accessible in one document.

So we'll keep panning away for those little gold flakes and, who knows, this may just get lucky and find that much needed large gold nugget that, just like the hardy panners of yore, we so eagerly crave!

UCC meetings for this year shall be held in The Medan Centre courtesy of the Udny Community Trust to whom our gratitude is extended. It should be noted the UCTC are providing use of the premises free of charge for the benefit of the community.

Your Community Council remains engaged in listening to the Udny residents, discussing issues/matters raised by those communities with the respective Aberdeenshire Authorities.

Engaging with our Aberdeenshire Council provides benefit for both parties. The respective 'Shire Council departments are made aware of the matters important to our communities while your Community Council gains knowledge of the workings and constraints related to the council departments concerned. On many occasions we do not agree nor are able to reach a resolution which satisfies the community. Often this is due to constraints experienced through existing Policies and procedures.

While Aberdeenshire departments have a duty to prepare those Policies the scope of Policy is generally guided by higher level Policy generated by the Scottish Government, often with terms of any potential deviation outlined.

We have to live within the Policies applied even if we personally disagree with particular elements. What should be noted by all is that policies have a predetermined life. When determining the 'new' policy Aberdeenshire Council generally circulates a survey for comment. The opportunity for constructive comment lies with all within our communities. Your opinion /significant concerns must be voiced. Through those, an assessment may be made identifying the most common concern, permitting a focused presentation for consideration by the Council.

This does not guarantee change but it provides a stronger and focused message to present to the respective authority.


Current activity of interest to the Communities within Aberdeenshire being -

'The Council Plan sets out the Strategic Priority of Resilient Communities. To deliver this priority it was agreed that Aberdeenshire Council would develop and implement a Place Strategy that considers the current and future needs of communities.'

'As well as supporting the delivery of the Council's Strategic Priority of Resilient Communities it is also noted that the Place Strategy can help to deliver the Scottish Government's Place Principle. Both the priority and the principle aim to provide a more effective and collaborative way to achieve long term change and improve outcomes across our communities.'

'The Place Principle is a way of bringing ideas about services, investments, resources and assets together under one roof and will include the development of Place Plans which are

An Update from the Udny Resilience Group

URG is an Udny Community Council initiative created in response to Storm Arwen

What have we achieved since our last update?

- Speaking and engaging with local groups, stakeholders, Aberdeenshire Council and the Emergency Services to communicate our plans and ambitions. We attended the Pitmedden Christmas event at The Medan Centre and spoke to 60 members of the community who were interested in volunteering with the Group,
- Agreement to utilise Whiterashes Hall, Pitmedden Hall, Pitmedden Bowling Club and Udny Green Hall as community rest centres in the event of power outages or other emergency situation
- Secured funding from Resilience Flood Fund to purchase bulk sand and 1,000 sandbags for community use to protect domestic properties or local business in the event of localised flooding. These sandbags are now located at Udny Green Hall and can be requested through social media channels when established
- Secured the provision of a 20ft container and 300 filled sandbags from Aberdeenshire Council for community use which will arrive in February and be located in Pitmedden
- Secured funding to enable the purchase of our first mobile generator, ancillaries and the
 installation of three changeover switches in Whiterashes Hall, Pitmedden Hall and Udny
 Green Hall. We expect this generator and the changeover switch installation to be
 complete by the end of March

What's next for the URG?

- Formally establishing the Resilience Group, governance and beginning to action our 2023 priorities in Q1;
- Developing our community resilience plan in cooperation with Aberdeenshire Council, emergency services representatives and other partners;
- Pursuing further funding from community avenues and other groups to allow us to purchase a second generator, personal protective equipment and VHF radios to aid communication
- Onboarding other suitable venues as community rest centres

y family roots here in Udny go back quite a distance in time, in fact one hundred and twenty years to be exact. I was reminded of this when I was looking at the recently released to public viewing of the 1921 Census. 





United's season started with a new management team beginning their regime with a radical remodelling of the playing squad. Stuart Anderson assisted by Martin Skinner has got stuck right in to the task of shifting the age profile of the side to bring younger players into this level of football and gradually lowering the average age of the team.

They have clearly kept in mind the need for retaining a mix of youth and experience because some the older heads like captain Graeme Rodger and full backs Crawford and Smith seem to relish having the proliferation of youthful energy alongside them.

Perhaps the most impressive asset of the new manager is his almost encyclopaedic knowledge of the expiry dates of the contracts of key players in other teams. This has allowed him to nip in with perfect timing to sign players from under the noses of others. As a player he had a remarkable talent for elegantly picking the ball of the tips of opponents' toes to devastating effect. There looks like there's some sort of parallel there,

Campbell has been a revelation: his prolific goal scoring has been known throughout the Highland League but to seems to have been enhanced by his move to United. At the time of writing [immediately after the away game against Banks O Dee] he has accomplished the amazing feat of scoring 8 goals in 3 games. [Hat tricks against Turriff and Clachnacuddin and a brace against Banks] He is a strong direct player in the mould of old fashioned centre forwards with the uncanny striker's instinct for sniffing out goal scoring opportunities.

Other new signings have already established themselves as first team regulars with special qualities to offer. Julian Wade was picked up from Brechin. The Dominica international forward was a fan's favourite at previous club, Brechin city and has become likewise at North Lodge where his close control and uncanny ability to wrong foot defenders make him an exciting one to watch. Mathew Mclean is a newcomer to the North East and when it was known that his oil industry career had taken him to this neck of the woods there was considerable interest in securing the big central defender. He is a big, strong



player, an imposing presence at the heart of the defence but who is deployed all around the park for his prodigious throw ins. He throws the ball further and higher than anyone I have seen in my 70 years of following the game. A throw in from him if taken from near the corner flag is as good as a corner kick and can reach the back stick area. He attributes this capacity to technique but his physique suggests that there's more to it than that alone.

More recently Rhys Thomas has signed. He is another central defender who looks cool under pressure whose physical progress has been quicker than anticipated. Mark Gallagher is a classic box to box player who has been almost ever present in the starting eleven since being picked up as member of the Dons under 20 side. Given the Don's recent performances and the standard of players recently recruited there, it seems that Formartine management have a better eye for emerging talent than their Pittodrie equivalents!

This level of improvement in the composition of the squad now seems to be reflecting in improvements in performance. Expectations of a successful season had initially been constrained by the need for and the process of rebuilding. Getting good players is one thing but getting them to gel as a team on the park is another entirely, particularly when they are part timers. However the results are there for all to see. Currently United sit in 4th place in the League and have won every League game in 2023 frequently clocking up big scores in the process.

The League Championship looks to be 43 heading to Brechin, Buckie, Brora or the Broch [what a shower of B's that is!] but the campaign is at just about the two thirds stage and there's a lot of football still to be played. Brechin are as yet undefeated but are by no means invincible. They and Buckie sit a few points above, in order, Broch, United and Brora, and some teams have games in hand over others. The likelihood is that it will go down to the wire between Brechin and Buckie, but there is only one side with a 100% record for 2023 and that's the one at North Lodge. Par undefeated run will end. Exciting times.

P.S.

United stretched their 100% run in 2023 in absolutely stunning style by beating League Leaders Brechin City in a floodlit game at North Lodge on 22nd February. The significance of this 2-0 win can not be understated - Brechin are the current League Leaders and had until this game a completely undefeated record since the start of the season. United won convincingly by 2-0 and are looking at moment like the best team in the league.

The disappointing bit is that even were they to win every game between now and the end of the season, they will need other teams to beat Brechin, Buckie, Brora and the Broch before they can finish much better than about fourth - the position they are in at present.

But next season?. Hold on to your hats!
